

# STEP INTO THE PICTURE

*Southern Sinfonia* @ Winchester Cathedral

4<sup>th</sup> March to 8<sup>th</sup> April 2006

The Cathedral is the venue for *Step into the Picture*, an exciting first collaboration between artist Paul Forsey, Southern Sinfonia and the Cathedral in a cross-media exploration of The Passion and other moments in the life of Jesus, through visual, musical and spiritual reflection, to be held in the North Presbytery Aisle during the first few weeks of Lent.

For some time, Paul Forsey has been working on paintings that, in a sense, rediscover illuminated manuscripts and how the masters that created them approached the subject. The storytelling is direct, the picture plane flat and the colours strong. Emerging from this was a New Testament for children and adults and it is 24 of the paintings from this that we will see in the Cathedral. As each picture takes a month or more to create, there is over two years of work in the production of the paintings themselves.

A new departure for Paul Forsey is the association of the visual arts with music. In fact they are perfect partners, as both are abstract languages, speaking without bias to people regardless of nationality, age, gender or any other potential limitations to understanding. The music and architecture of the Cathedral have, of course, spoken together spiritually for hundreds of years, and it is always exciting to have additional elements in the building that can enhance precisely that.

Southern Sinfonia have a strong reputation, not only for their own musical endeavours, but also of education and outreach, and are bringing their very special experience to the project by organising lunchtime concerts in the North Transept. Artists will include musicians of all ages from the Winchester area.

STEP INTO THE PICTURE will be available for viewing during normal Cathedral opening hours:  
08.30 – 18.00, every day.

Please note that visiting times can vary for special events. It is advisable to check when making a special journey. There will be a charge for visiting the Cathedral introduced on 1<sup>st</sup> March.
